


Our Story

Youth Symphony History

Started in 1980 as a small junior high school orchestra performing only one concert, who could have foreseen that, led by founder Gary Nicholson, the Colorado Springs Youth Symphony Association would grow into one of the **Premier Youth Orchestra Programs in the country?** Now, in our 46th year, the CSYSA features ten large Auditioned Ensembles, many high-level Chamber Music Groups, and a strong introductory grade school program.





To inspire young musicians in the Pikes Peak Region to become future leaders, to provide artistic and personal development as well as diverse musical experiences for young musicians, and to collaboratively create and share excellent music that bridges cultures and communities.

We are the most comprehensive instrumental music program for youth in this part of the country. Our mission compels us to provide Artistic Development through high quality, diverse music experiences that enrich the cultural environment here in the Pikes Peak Region and around the world. Our growing roster of Youth Music Ensembles uses the life-altering power of musical performance to connect with audiences, playing for many thousands of Children and Adults yearly, including many audiences that have little or no exposure to live orchestral music.

Our Very Own CSYSA HOME!



After years of efforts to establish a permanent home, in 2021 we located and then purchased the ideal facility - Village Christian Church - well-located near the intersection of Union and Fillmore. This exciting venue features over 18,000 sq. ft. of flexible rehearsal, performance, meeting, office, kitchen, and storage space, including two large rehearsal/performance halls and numerous sectional rooms.

CSYSA's ENCORE! CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

We have subsequently launched the *ENCORE!* Youth Symphony Capital Campaign with the goal of completing the purchase of our CSYSA home and restoring, upgrading, and restructuring the facility for our needs today and into the future. To be named after *Kathy Loo* and the *Bloom Foundation*, our completed campus will forever be a *Beacon for the Arts* here in our community, *empowering generations of young musicians*, and assuring the future of the CSYSA.

The Power of Touring

Every CSYSA performing group tours - some to local schools and some across the state or the Southwest, while every second year, the full Youth Symphony Orchestra has historically traveled abroad to share our great music and our talented young role models with the world.



Whether playing here at home in the Pikes Peak or Ent Centers, or far afield in New York's Carnegie Hall, New Zealand, China, Australia, Bulgaria, Japan, Greece, or beyond, our musicians benefit from the comprehensive CSYSA instrumental music program. Exposing our young musicians to various cultures and music forms is an essential part of our CSYSA education.

While on tour, we introduce audiences to the very best of American youth.

The Latest Youth Symphony Tour to New Zealand and Australia

Following our highly successful Greece Tour in 2022, the Youth Symphony Orchestra completed a dramatic tour to **New Zealand and Australia** in June of 2024. Our talented young ambassadors delivered two weeks of thrilling performances culminating in a stellar concert/performance in the newly renovated **Sydney Opera House! IMAGINE!**

The trip featured performances of the powerful 'Alpha and Omega', specially commissioned for our 40th Anniversary and composed by noted American composer Soon Hee Newbold. On the tour the Youth Symphony was honored to receive the 'Global Impact Award', presented by United World Concert Tours for our promoting of International Understanding through our Music and Travels.

Planning is now well underway for our 2026 International Tour.

Our Chamber Music Program

YS Musicians are encouraged to form and to perform in **Chamber Music Groups**, including our unique Baroque Chamber Group, at no extra charge to parents. We believe that chamber music skills are a key part of music education. In 2017 the highly acclaimed **Manitou Chamber Music Festival** was incorporated into CSYSA and now takes full advantage of our CSYSA home facility.

A Variety of Music Disciplines

While orchestras traditionally focus on classical music, we believe in exposing our young musicians to a broad scope of music from various cultures.

CSYSA is pleased to have launched our second auditioned Jazz Ensemble, **Pinnacle Jazz!** Our Jazz Ensembles, now featuring 40 of the region's top jazz musicians, perform at regional Jazz Festivals, in Jazz Clubs, and on the big stage alongside our other ensembles!

We have recorded and released an **Orchestral Jazz CD**, composed by YS Alum Sean Hennessey, recorded with the Youth Symphony Orchestra and his 'Hennessey 6' Jazz Group, produced by multiple-Grammy-Award-winning Jesse Lewis, and distributed by Summit Records.

Honoring Music Teachers!

The CSYSA mission would not be possible without the dedicated **Private and School Music Teachers** that instruct and inspire young musicians everywhere.

We work diligently to connect with and collaborate with all Music Teachers, knowing that the **arts in our Community are at their strongest when every music program thrives**.

Seeking 'Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion'

Believing that every young musician must feel safe and welcome in CSYSA, we are focusing our internal training and policies to help overcome DEI shortfalls in our community.

To ensure that all students are comfortable in concert dress, our policy was revised so that all musicians may select their preferred uniform. We have updated enrollment paperwork to honor and celebrate the spectrum of gender identities, preferred names and pronouns, and familial relationships for students and their caregivers. To further reduce socioeconomic barriers to participation, we expanded our financial aid program by 50% and established a subsidized instrument rental program. As we actively seek equitable, accessible participation for all in our community, we ratified our non-discrimination policy to align with our values of inclusion for all musicians, staff, and community members. The organization's website and social media pages now better reflect the inclusive and welcoming nature of CSYSA.

We are committed to including/ to welcoming all segments of our community in our ongoing learning journey and the Mission of the CSYSA.

Stronger Through Partnering

We continue to strengthen our position in the Pikes Peak Region by partnering with other community artistic and service groups. This includes long-standing partnerships with: the Colorado Springs Philharmonic, the Colorado Springs Children's Chorale, the Ent Center for the Arts, the Colorado College Summer Festival, the UCCS Music Department (offering our students College Credit), the Colorado Springs Conservatory, and we are committed to exploring new partnership possibilities.

C/S Philharmonic Conductor Laureate Josep Caballé Domenech!

In April 2025 Josep Caballé Domenech returned to the US to conduct the full C/S Philharmonic and our Youth Symphony in a dramatic Gala Concert featuring Mahler's Symphony #1 at the Pikes Peak Center.

Long a CSYSA supporter and founder of the Barcelona Musician Exchange, our JCD Scholarship was created in his honor. Josep also conducted the 'side-by-side' concert of Shostakovich's Symphony #5 in 2024 at the ENT Center, and 'Carmina Burana at the Pikes Peak Center in 2023 - accompanied by 170 singers.
